This research project aims to improve access to medicines, generate learnings, data and evidence regarding medicines prescribing, the most common health intervention provided globally, (Aitken & Kleinrock, 2020) and in conjunction with designated Registered Nurse (RN) proscribing.

Project 1 Understanding consumer preferences for prescribing using Discrete Choice Experiment.

Project 2 Co-design a tailored implementation and evaluation strategy suitable for various health care contexts.

Projects 3 and 4 will evaluate the feasibility of using the model developed in project 2 to implement designated RN prescribing, measuring outcomes before and after the introduction using the Quintuple Aim Framework, specifically patient experience, patient outcomes, costs, clinician well-being and health equity (Itchhaporia, 2021).

Project 5 is a discrete health economics research project to examine the cost-benefit of the introduction of Designated RN prescribing.

Health Consumers Queensland will provide guidance to support meaningful partnering for consultations, co-design workshops, and dissemination of project findings throughout the project lifecycle to support the partnering relationship (in-kind support for the Project over 2 years).

The project seeks impactful outcomes by addressing the care experiences for consumers and the unique needs of Queensland communities, clinician wellbeing, and support the optimisation of the overall healthcare system through an evidence-based designated RN proscribing model.

Health Consumers Queensland consents to be identified as a partner in successful applications in media releases, on the NHMRC website. HCQ will work closely with the project

team and other partner organisations to facilitate the recruitment and engagement of consumers throughout the five project stages. HCQ will provide guidance to support meaningful partnering for consultations, co-design workshops, and dissemination of project findings throughout the project lifecycle to support the partnering relationship. Additionally, a HCQ staff member is sought to be an investigator on the project team throughout its lifecycle.

At the heart of Health Consumers Queensland is the belief that consumers should be involved at every level of the health system planning, provision, reform and research. Our organisation aims to support consumers and health providers to collaborate to improve the safety and quality of health services.
