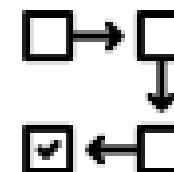

Outcomes and benefits

- Scalable – across forms for other referees, jurisdictions
- Matters are kept out of courts at earliest possible stage
- Benefits exceed costs, BCR = 2.3
- Based on evidence and EAST behavioural design principles

2 Defaults on QP9

Two simple questions on the QP9 prompt police to refer to restorative justice

Amended QP9 form

Has this case been referred to Adult Restorative Justice Conferencing (ARJC)?

- Yes
- No

(If previous question responded **No**) What is the reason for non-referral to ARJC?

- Offender has history of related offences
- Offender refusal
- Victim refusal
- Offender has participated in ARJC previously
- Offender is in breach of domestic violence/protection order
- Offender is in breach of an order
- Offender is in breach of release conditions
- Orders or conditions prevent contact between parties
