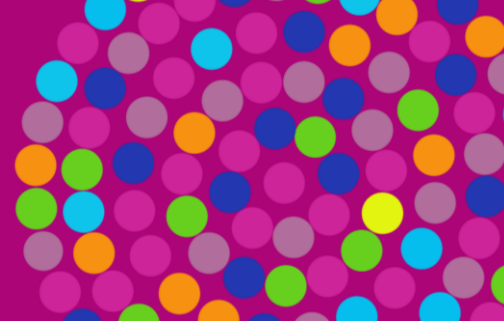

	<p>Professor Marilyn Campbell Marilyn Campbell is a professor at QUT. She is a registered teacher and psychologist and member of the C4IE. Her main clinical and research interests are anxiety disorders in young people and the effects of bullying, especially cyberbullying in schools.</p>
	<p>Ms Melissa Close Melissa Close works as an Outreach and Engagement Officer with the C4IE at QUT. She has over a decade of experience as an educator in international and domestic settings. She holds a Master of Education (Leadership and Management) and is currently pursuing a Master of Philosophy at QUT focused on the systemic implementation of social and emotional learning in educational settings in Australia and the United States.</p>
	<p>Professor Penny Van Bergen Penny Van Bergen is a professor of educational psychology and current Head of School in the School of Education, University of Wollongong, New South Wales. Her research focuses on social factors contributing to child and adolescent development (e.g., memory and learning, emotional competence, wellbeing), including broader relationship quality and specific interactional techniques.</p>
	<p>Dr Kate de Bruin Kate de Bruin is a former high school teacher and Senior Lecturer in inclusive education at Monash University, Australia. Her research is based on a human rights approach to education and draws on the Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) framework to examine funding models, as well as system, school and classroom level practices that are supported by evidence, with specific attention to the inclusion students with a disability.</p>
	<p>Professor Linda Graham Linda Graham is Director of QUT's Centre for Inclusive Education (C4IE) and a Professor in the Faculty of Creative Industries, Education and Social Justice. She has authored over 100 scholarly publications including the best-selling book, Inclusive Education for the 21st Century (the new 2nd Edition of which is due for release Nov 2023). Linda is currently leading two major projects in QLD schools: the Accessible Assessment ARC Linkage project, and the Central Queensland Region Leading Inclusive Education Reform: Middle Leaders project.</p>
