HDR BURSARIES – CONFERENCE 2023



Deus Ex Machina – Law – Technology – Humanities

The Association is pleased to announce the provision of bursaries to assist HDR research students to attend the Law, Literature and Humanities Association of Australasia Conference, *Deus Ex Machina – Law – Technology – Humanities*. The conference will be held in-person at QUT, Brisbane. Conference proceedings will run from **12-14 December 2023**, with a HDR Workshop on **11 December 2023**.

The Law, Literature and Humanities Association of Australasia (LLHAA) has set aside \$4,000 AUD for bursaries. Successful candidates enrolled at all Australian universities (except WA) will receive an award of \$350 AUD; successful candidates enrolled in WA universities and at institutions outside of Australia will be awarded \$500 AUD in order to assist with the additional cost of travel. Bursaries will be awarded based on academic merit. The exact number of bursaries will be determined by the management committee of the LLHAA.

APPLICATION

Applications for bursaries close on **4 September 2023**.

Bursaries will be awarded by the Management Committee of the LLHAA. Successful and unsuccessful applicants will be advised by **25 September 2023**. The Committee's decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.

CRITERIA

1. Applicants must be enrolled in a PhD, MPhil, Research Masters, or other research postgraduate programme.
2. Applicants must have a paper submitted to present at the Law, Literature and Humanities Association of Australasia Conference, [*Deus Ex Machina – Law – Technology – Humanities*](#).
3. Applicants must provide a brief statement outlining how their paper and postgraduate research contributes to the development of law, literature and the humanities.
4. Applicants must provide a current CV.

EXPECTATIONS

It is expected that successful applicants will attend the HDR Workshop on 11 December 2023 as well as attend each day of the main conference.

It is expected that successful applicants will provide a brief (500 word maximum) reflection on one session of the conference. This piece will be published on the Law, Literature and Humanities Association of Australasia blog (<https://www.lawlithum.org/blog/>). Deadline for submission will be *28 February 2024*.

It is also expected that the successful applicants will submit a final version of their paper to a relevant peer reviewed journal for publication. Each successful applicant will be assigned a member of the Association's Management Committee to assist with mentoring the paper through to publication.
