Students' discovery of what they can do*

- Just telling students that they can learn something doesn't work. They have to discover for themselves what they can do.
- The **challenge** is creating the assignments and learning experiences that promote that discovery.
- Progress is gradual and students may not see it, but there's
 often a moment of breakthrough when students catch a
 glimpse of what they can do.
- The powerful part of a student's self-discovery is its ripple effect, and if the ripples keep spreading, they consummate transformative learning.
- Help students to examine their own performance or understanding of a unit's content, throughout the semester.
- Student discoveries of their learning affect us, their teachers they grab us, hold us, fascinate us, and give us hope.
