According to a paper published by the **Sanford University School of Education**:

“Learning theorists have carried out a debate on **how people learn** that began at least as far back as the Greek philosophers, Socrates (469 –399 B.C.), Plato (427 – 347 B.C.), and Aristotle (384 – 322 B.C).... To a substantial extent, the most effective strategies for learning depend on what kind of learning is desired and toward what ends.”
