Assessments, learning objectives, and instructional strategies*

- Assessments should reveal how well students have achieved the intended learning outcomes.
- For this to occur, assessments, learning objectives, and instructional strategies need to be closely aligned.
- To ensure that these three components of a unit are aligned, we need to ask ourselves the following questions:
- Learning objectives: What do we want students to know how to do when they leave this unit?
- Assessments: What kinds of tasks will reveal whether students have achieved the learning objectives we have identified?
- Instructional strategies: What kinds of activities in and out of class will reinforce the learning objectives and prepare students for assessments?
