T³: Today's Teaching Tip Start-Stop-Continue*

After receiving feedback (from the Pulse Survey, for example), organising it into **issues and priorities**, can help you decide:

- 1. What you should start doing.
- 2. What you should stop doing.
- 3. What you should continue doing.

This will also help you explain to the class:

- That students often believe that everyone in the class thinks the same way about the way a class is going, but the feedback shows that there are conflicting recommendations.
- The suggestions you will be accommodating, such as, for example, providing additional practice problems.
- The suggestions you are not willing to accommodate, and why?
 For example, you will not spend much of the class time addressing assumed knowledge (from pre-requisite units.)
